

## CHECKLIST

### Preparing to come to Centennial

- Satisfy conditions of offer of admission
- Apply for a Study Permit (and Visa, if required) at the nearest Canadian embassy or consulate <http://www.centennialcollege.ca/international/studypermit>
- Pay applicable tuition and fees <http://www.centennialcollege.ca/international/wiretransfer>
- Book flight/travel arrangements
- Apply for accommodation (Residence or Homestay) <http://www.centennialcollege.ca/international/housing>
- Register for Student Orientation session (check Centennial International web site)
- Confirm semester start date (check Centennial web site)
- Decide on banking arrangements: transfer money, purchase travelers cheques, credit cards, etc.
- Register for classes
- Have medical examination and inoculations (if applicable)

### Before you leave

- Confirm flight
- Book transport to Centennial College by completing International Student Arrival Form (at least five days before your arrival) <http://db2.centennialcollege.ca/forms/StudentArrival.html>
- Pack your luggage appropriately (Toronto has four seasons)

### When you arrive in Canada

- Provide all required entry documents for immigration officer upon arrival to Canada
- Call home to tell parents/guardians you have arrived safely
- Visit the International Centre at the Progress Campus (bring appropriate documents)
- Attend the International Student Orientation session
- Accommodation – pick up your keys
- Book Assessment test(s) (see your Admissions Officer)
- Have your photo taken for your student ID
- Obtain your student ID card
- Open a bank account
- Obtain your Health Insurance card
- Talk to an Academic Advisor to confirm appropriate courses for your degree
- Register for classes (if you have not already done so)
- Update your Toronto address and telephone number on myCentennial
