SoT Wins Post Secondary Education Award



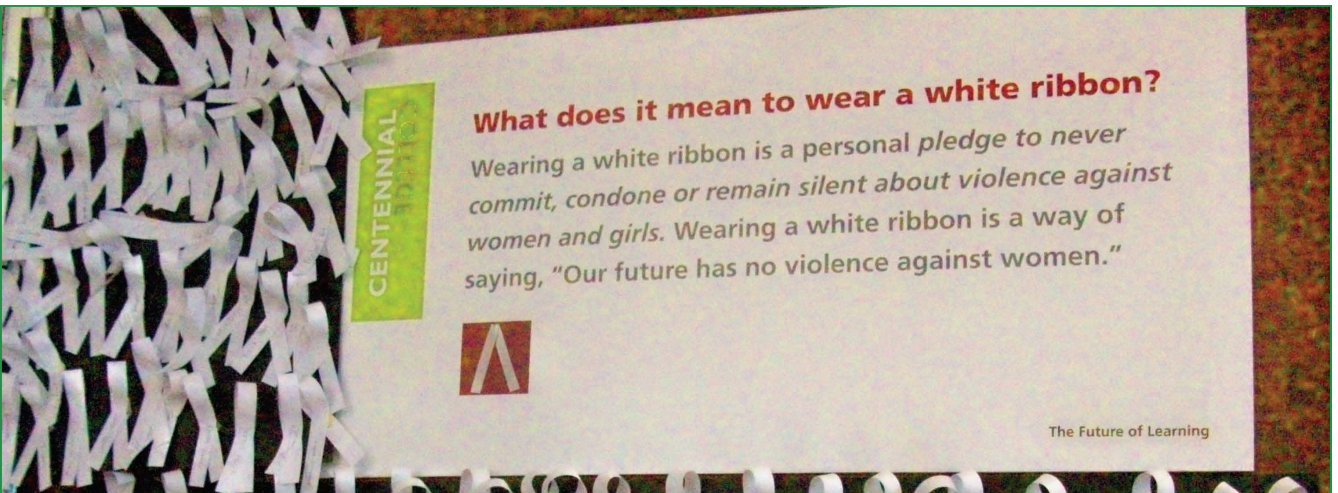
Above: Coordinator **Jim Passant** accepting the Canadian Aviation Maintenance Council Award from CAMC Executive Director Robert Donald.

SoT Demonstrates Support for White Ribbon



According to the White Ribbon Campaign (WRC) website, "The main goal of the WRC is to end violence in all its forms against women." The WRC strive to accomplish this goal in five ways: 1) Challenging everyone to speak out, and think about their own beliefs, language and actions. 2) Educating young people, especially young men and boys on the issue through the educational resources we produce. 3) Raising public awareness of the issue. 4) Working in partnership with women's organizations, the corporate sector, the media and other partners to create a future with no violence against women. 5) Supporting other WR Campaigns with our experience, resources and networks. According to WRC, "The most widespread problems are physical violence against spouses and girlfriends (from hitting right up to murder) and sexual violence (usually committed by a boyfriend, husband, trusted adult, or family member.) There is also emotional abuse — sexual harassment at work or on the street, stalking, jokes that demean women, and controlling behaviour." Also, "...violence occurs in the form of genital mutilation of girls and trafficking of girls and young women into prostitution." The WRC was started in Canada in 1991 by a handful of men who decided, "...they had a responsibility to urge men to speak out about violence against women." The WRC runs every year from November 25th, the International Day for the Eradication of Violence Against Women, until December 6th, Canada's National Day of Remembrance and Action on Violence Against Women.
