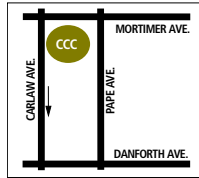

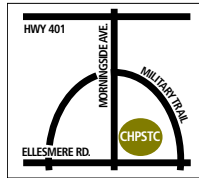

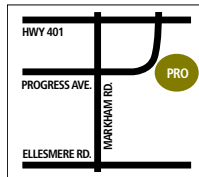

Program Code: 7018

This program provides practical skills to those wishing to become certified as adult trainers in a workplace, those interested in teaching at a college level, and those who are experts in their field who want to learn how to teach/share their expertise with adult learners.

Courses are offered part-time (evenings, weekends and online) for the convenience of working learners.

Our program is based on the premise that the most effective learning takes place within a positive environment characterized by knowledgeable and enthusiastic teachers, teaching strategies that suit diverse learner needs, and an atmosphere of dignity and mutual respect. This experiential program incorporates current research and multiple intelligence strategies to help learners stay motivated and engaged.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

There are no admission requirements, simply an expertise in whatever field you wish to teach/train, a desire to be a successful teacher/trainer, and good English communication skills.

You are welcome to take any course just for interest or professional development; however, if you are pursuing the program, you need to follow the program structure/requirements.

Program Goals:

At the end of the program, the graduate will be able to:

1. Apply current pedagogical issues when developing course/workshop curriculum;
2. Apply the principles of adult education, curriculum and instructional design to meet the diverse needs and learning styles of adult learners;
3. Assess the adult learner using a wide variety of evaluation techniques and tools;
4. Analyze one's own personal learning profile and educational biases in relation to their role of adult educator;
5. Incorporate diverse learner profiles in East Toronto to curriculum design and delivery;
6. Use appropriate technology to meet diverse learning needs;
7. Demonstrate professional practice and competence through self-reflection and peer, learner and instructor critiques;
8. Create a teaching/professional portfolio.



Program structure

This continuing education (part-time) certificate program is offered evenings and weekends, for the convenience of working learners. It starts almost every month throughout the year (with the first course, Foundations of Teaching and Learning CEID-001).

You take the three core/mandatory courses first, in sequence, and then choose three courses (six credits) from the elective list. (The electives may be taken all at once as your schedule allows, or paced slowly.) The program should be completed within five years.

The final mandatory course in your program should be Portfolio Development. During the program you work on building your teaching/training portfolio for inclusion in this final course.
