HOUSING AND OUR RESIDENCE

Centennial offers space for over 300 students, and premium features you will not find in a typical residence.

While the Residence is at the Progress campus, it is for students attending classes at any of Centennial's campuses. Convenient and frequent public bus service easily transports residents to the nearby light-rail station, which links to the subway system.

Each of the smoke-free, climate-controlled furnished rooms (single* and double accommodation available) is equipped with an in-suite four-piece bathroom, microwave, compact refrigerator, telephone, cable television and internet access.

In 2011, an eight-month Student Residence Agreement from September 2011 to April 2012 cost \$7,000.00 for single accommodation* and \$4,500.00 for shared accommodation, utilities included.

LOCKERS

You can arrange for a locker on your campus at the beginning of each program year. Lockers are available to full-time students, for a rental fee, on a first-come, first-served basis via *myCentennial* if you pay your fees and register online, or through your campus Enrolment Services Office.

You'll need to provide your own lock, and should install it within the first week of classes. For your convenience, locks are available in campus bookstores. In order to legally occupy a locker, you need to pay the locker rental fee. Locker rentals are based on the academic year, which begins in September and ends in August. All locker rental agreements terminate at the end of August for students who have remained enrolled in full-time classes for each semester for the academic year. Locker rental agreements are terminated immediately upon official withdrawal from your program or after not registering as a full-time student for one semester. Locks that have been placed on a locker by someone other than the person who paid the annual locker rental fee are considered to be illegally occupied and will be removed. The contents of an illegally occupied locker will be held by Campus Security until the penalty fee is paid. The College will dispose of such locker contents within 14 days of the seizure.

Note: The College is not responsible for damage to, or theft of, contents of lockers. The College will dispose of contents left in lockers within 14 days of the end of an academic semester.

PARKING

PARKING

When you park on campus weekdays between midnight and 6 pm or weekends from 5 pm-8 am you are required to purchase and properly display a valid parking permit. You are also required to park in your assigned lot in a proper space.

Student permits are available from your campus Enrolment Services Office.

SHORT TERM PARKING RATES

Daily rates are available in the visitors lot at all campuses. Hourly rates are only available at our campuses from the pay and display machines near the campus visitor lot. Rates are:

CARE – COLLEGE AUTO RESPONSE EMERGENCY SERVICE

Centennial's CARE Service program is designed to assist students, staff, faculty and visitors who may experience vehicle problems while on Campus. We are not trained mechanics, but will do our best to assist you and help get you safely on your way. If we are unable to get you on your way we will provide access to a telephone and appropriate phone number to help you summon other assistance.

ACCESSIBLE PARKING

A limited number of accessible parking spaces are available for people with a permit from the Ministry of Transportation and Communications. In order to park in these areas you are required to display your ministry permit as well as a valid college-parking permit. Anyone with a temporary disability may apply to Campus Security for a medical parking permit for up to 60 days. For further information please contact your Campus Security Office.

PARKING REGULATIONS

The parking regulations (no parking areas, fire routes, reserved spaces, drop-off areas, disabled persons spaces, etc.) are enforced 24 hours per day, seven days per week. LEARN

Centennial College Libraries have the services and resources you need to succeed. Bring your assignments to the library and ask the staff to help you get started with your research. Student Financial Services

It is wise to plan ahead for the cost of college. Begin investigating the resources available to you well before the start of the new school year.

Various financial aid programs are available for students who meet eligibility requirements. Our Student Financial Services Office has all the details and can help you search and direct you to apply for any financial assistance for which you may qualify. HOW MUCH WILL COLLEGE COST?

As a general guideline, single students living on their own can expect to spend about \$11,000 per academic year on living expenses, tuition, books and supplies. Your expenses will vary depending on your circumstances. Married students with dependants, for example, will have higher living costs than singles living at home and may require up to \$20,000 per year.

You can get a good idea of your own financial picture by creating a realistic list of your resources and expenses. Your list of resources should include sources of income such as: summer jobs, savings, contributions from parents, spouses or other family members, and money you can earn working part time while you're in school.

Your list of expenses should include college costs (see fees, pages 21-23), as well as room and board, transportation, clothing, laundry, personal care and entertainment.

If you find your estimated expenses are greater than your resources, your next step is to arrange the financial aid you need.

ONTARIO STUDENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (OSAP)

This government-sponsored program is the major source of financial assistance for post-secondary students. OSAP funds are intended to supplement your own resources in meeting the costs of your education. In addition, the assistance you're eligible for varies according to program length and whether you're single, married or have dependants.

To apply for OSAP assistance, you have to be a fee-paying student attending Centennial full- or part-time in a Ministry approved post-secondary program of study.

In addition, each plan has its own particular requirements and qualifications; when you visit the Student Financial Services Office, we'll match you with the plans that meet your needs.

You should apply early for financial aid – no later than July 1st – to be sure funds are available when you start classes in September. Additional information can be found on OSAP's website at <http://osap.gov.on.ca>.

CENTENNIAL COLLEGE STUDENT ACCESS GUARANTEE

Centennial College is pleased to partner with the Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities to provide additional support to students who have been assessed for OSAP and whose costs have not been fully covered due to the limitations of the Ontario Student Assistance Program (OSAP). To meet the objectives of supporting our most financially vulnerable students who have applied for OSAP and are identified by the Ministry as having unmet need and a tuition and/or book shortfall, Centennial College is pleased to automatically assess and assign additional bursary funding to support these students in the second academic term of study.

CANADA STUDENT GRANT FOR PERSONS WITH DEPENDENTS

Sole-support parents and married students with dependent children may be eligible to receive a Canada Study Grant for Students with Dependents of up to a maximum of \$3,000 per academic year. Your eligibility is automatically calculated at the Ministry when your OSAP application is processed.

CANADA STUDENT GRANT FOR PERSONS WITH PERMANENT DISABILITIES (PD)

Qualifying students with permanent disabilities and demonstrating high financial need will automatically be considered by the Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities on behalf of the Government of Canada for grant funding up to a maximum of \$2,000.

CANADA STUDENT GRANT FOR PERSONS FROM LOW INCOME FAMILIES (LIF)

Qualifying first-time, first-year students from low income families demonstrating high financial need will automatically be considered by the Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities on behalf of the Government of Canada for grant funding up to a maximum of \$3,000.

ONTARIO ACCESS GRANT

Worth up to \$3,000, it assists first and second-year students from low-income and moderate income families with tuition costs.

ONTARIO ACCESS GRANT FOR CROWN WARDS

Worth up to \$3,000. It assists current and former Crown wards with tuition costs.

ONTARIO STUDENT OPPORTUNITY GRANT

Students who have a Canada Student Loan greater than \$7,000 for a two-semester academic year will receive a grant for the amount above the \$7,000 (subject to maximums), if you complete your year of studies and after the Ministry has verified with Revenue Canada the income information supplied in connection with your OSAP application. The Ministry has imposed an academic progression standard requiring that all full-time students must pass a minimum 60 per cent of their full-time course load to be eligible for this grant. If you withdraw or stop attending classes before you complete your academic year, you will not be eligible for an Ontario Student Opportunity Grant. This grant (previously called loan forgiveness) is paid directly to your service provider by the Ministry after all criteria is met.

CANADA STUDENT GRANT FOR PERSONS FROM MIDDLE-INCOME FAMILIES

Students from middle-income families who qualify for a federal student loan and meet the specific grant eligibility requirements will receive \$100 per month of study. The grant is available for all years of a university undergraduate, college, or trade school program.

THE ONTARIO DISTANCE GRANTS

These are intended to assist eligible full-time postsecondary students from remote and rural areas with travel costs incurred as a result of attending Ontario's publicly funded colleges and universities.

TRANSITION GRANT

For former 2008-2009 Millennium Bursary Recipients only: Eligible recipients of the Canada Millennium Scholarship Foundation (CMSF) Millennium bursary in 2008-2009 may receive a transition grant which does not need to be paid back, for up to three additional years of undergraduate study, following the sunset of the CMSF in 2009. The transition grant will equal the difference between the CMSF Millennium bursary received during the 2008-2009 school year and any Canada Student Grants for Persons from Low-Income Families or Canada Student Grants for Persons from Middle-Income Families.

THE TEXTBOOK AND TECHNOLOGY GRANT

This grant helps full-time community college and university students with their costs for textbooks and technology.

ONTARIO WORK STUDY PLAN (OWSP)

OWSP provides on-campus, part-time work for students receiving OSAP and who need additional financial assistance. It's aimed at students whose financial needs can't be fully met by other OSAP plans, or those who want to reduce the amount of their student loans. If this fits your situation, ask one of our financial aid specialists for information about OWSP opportunities.

BURSARIES FOR STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

This bursary (grants that do not have to be repaid) provide financial assistance up to \$10,000 per year to students who have special educational expenses because of a disability. It supplements the regular OSAP loan plans and ensures that students with disabilities do not have to carry extra debt to cover their special expenses. This bursary is administered through the Centre for Students with Disabilities (CSD) in conjunction with Student Financial Services.

ONTARIO CHILD CARE BURSARY

Students with children can get assistance with child care costs through this bursary (a grant that does not have to be repaid); if you have three or more children under 11 years of age requiring child care costs. The bursary supplements the regular OSAP loan plans and ensures that students do not have to carry extra debt to pay for those child care costs. Our financial aid specialists can help you make arrangements.

ONTARIO SPECIAL BURSARY PLAN

This bursary encourages financially needy students to pursue, for the first time, part-time post-secondary studies through our School of Continuing Education.

QUEEN ELIZABETH II – AIMING FOR THE TOP SCHOLARSHIP

These scholarships are designed to recognize students who have shown academic excellence at the high school level and to assist students with financial need (based on their OSAP application). The students must be graduating from high school in the year 2011/2012. The value of these scholarships are determined based on the student's financial need and is renewable for up to four years.
